Nominee for LCYC Vice-Commodore

MICHAEL SAMULIN

Michael Samulin has spent most of his life in Houston, Austin, and San Antonio, Texas. Michael attended the University of Texas at Austin. He has been married to his wife Victoria for 30 years, and they have a 28 year old daughter, Stephanie.

Michael Samulin has been in the security alarm industry since 1984. He is the founder and majority owner of Intruder Alert Systems of San Antonio, Inc.
