

**LAKE CANYON YACHT CLUB
ANNUAL MEETING - AGENDA ITEM
FOR VOTE AT THE 2017 ANNUAL MEETING**

**CHANGE TO BYLAWS, ARTICLE I MEMBERSHIP,
Section III Definitions of Classes of Membership, (g) Junior**

Bylaw as currently stated:

(g) **Junior** members shall be those members seven (7) years of age to seventeen (17) years of age whose parents/guardians are not Club members and who have complied with the requirements set out in Section IV, Admission of Members. In addition to the requirements in Section IV, the application must include the signature of the applicant's parent/guardian and consent of that person for such background checks as directed by the Board of Governors. Members in this category who are TSA Circuit participants may continue as Junior members through age nineteen (19). A Junior member who wants to continue as a member of the Club after expiration of the Junior membership must submit an application for another class of membership.

Bylaw as revised (change highlighted):

(g) **Junior** members shall be those members seven (7) years of age to seventeen (17) years of age, **or who are still enrolled in and attending high school,** whose parents/guardians are not Club members and who have complied with the requirements set out in Section IV, Admission of Members. In addition to the requirements in Section IV, the application must include the signature of the applicant's parent/guardian and consent of that person for such background checks as directed by the Board of Governors. Members in this category who are TSA Circuit participants may continue as Junior members through age nineteen (19). A Junior member who wants to continue as a member of the Club after expiration of the Junior membership must submit an application for another class of membership.

Discussion of Change:

Our rationale for the change is a junior member who turns 18 and is still a full-time high school student may not yet be able to afford the additional monthly maintenance fee required of a Student member. Their situation in life is not likely to dramatically change once they turn 18 if they are still full-time high school students living at home.

We do not believe this change would create an unreasonable burden on the Club or lost opportunity for revenue since most Junior member who would likely benefit from this proposed change would be in this "in-between" status for a maximum of nine months (Sept to May), but more likely for a shorter period until they graduate.
